### *What is the Glebe House Museum & Gertrude Jekyll Garden?*

The Glebe House Museum & Gertrude Jekyll Garden is private, non-profit, 501(c)3 historic house museum & garden located at 49 Hollow Road in Woodbury, Connecticut. It was the home of the Rev. John Rutgers Marshall and his family from 1771-1786, during the turmoil of the American War for Independence. ### *What is the Summer Experience for Children?*

Five weeks of summer programs are offered at the Glebe House Museum & Gertrude Jekyll Garden that allow children to take a step into another time and discover a new world in their own back yard. Children experience hands-on learning at our 18<sup>th</sup> century historic site. Programs are designed to be interactive, exciting and to stimulate further interest in history, horticulture, early American trades and the arts. Programs offered include: "Hands on History", "Art of the Garden", "A Day in the Life", "Colonial Textiles" and more.

### *Program Leader Requirements/Expectations:*

- Entering/Current College Students ages 18+
- Be available to participate in summer orientation & program preparation - (June/Flexible Hours)
- Be available Monday-Friday, 8:30 am - 3:30 pm. (No classes will be held July 4 or 5)
- Be available to participate for the full five (5) week program running from June 24<sup>th</sup> - July 26<sup>th</sup>.
- Be reliable, respectful and enthusiastic.
- Be able to prepare & lead daily activities with groups of children and youth leadership participants.
- Be a good role model for the Youth Leadership Assistants.

### *Program Leader Benefits:*

- Community Service Hours for school and/or college applications.
- A stipend of \$200 per week. Total: \$1,000/5 weeks.
- Leadership & Teaching experience.
- Tangible experience to show future employers.
- Possible college credit/independent study.
