Nonnewaug High School has 716 students enrolled in grades 9-12. The professional staff consists of highly trained and skilled individuals. Support service staff includes a school psychologist, social worker, school nurse and paraprofessionals. Nonnewaug’s primary purpose is to provide all students with access to a challenging program of studies. This program is designed to create a balance; impart a body of knowledge and provide the skills needed for lifelong learning. While Nonnewaug emphasizes the intellectual growth of students, it also stresses physical, emotional, social, ethical, and aesthetic development. In addition, it seeks to instill in its students an awareness of their civic opportunities and responsibilities in a democratic society.
